Gospel

St John 12:20-33

(p.101)

20 Now among those who went up to worship at the feast were some Greeks. **21** So these came to Philip, who was from Beth-sa'ida in Galilee, and said to him, "Sir, we wish to see Jesus." **22** Philip went and told Andrew; Andrew went with Philip and they told Jesus. **23** And Jesus answered them, "The hour has come for the Son of man to be glorified. **24** Truly, truly, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. **25** He who loves his life loses it, and he who hates his life in this world will keep it for eternal life. **26** If any one serves me, he must follow me; and where I am, there shall my servant be also; if any one serves me, the Father will honor him. **27** "Now is my soul troubled. And what shall I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? No, for this purpose I have come to this hour. **28** Father, glorify thy name." Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again." **29** The crowd standing by heard it and said that it had thundered. Others said, "An angel has spoken to him." **30** Jesus answered, "This voice has come for your sake, not for mine. **31** Now is the judgment of this world, now shall the ruler of this world be cast out; **32** and I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all men to myself." **33** He said this to show by what death he was to die.

Additional Readings for each Sunday. On any one Sunday there is actually four Readings: Old Testament, Psalm, Epistle and Gospel. All these readings would be used if we were having our “normal Service” so we have listed the Readings (not used) for this Sunday below. We will do this each week.

Psalm 51 1-12 (p.501)

1 Have mercy on me, O God, according to thy steadfast love; according to thy abundant mercy blot out my transgressions.2 Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin.3 For I know my transgressions, and my sin is ever before me.4 Against thee, thee only, have I sinned, and done that which is evil in thy sight, so that thou art justified in thy sentence and blameless in thy judgment.5 Behold, I was brought forth in iniquity, and in sin did my mother conceive me.6 Behold, thou desirest truth in the inward being; therefore

teach me wisdom in my secret heart.**7** Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean; wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow.**8** Fill me with joy and gladness; let the bones which thou hast broken rejoice.**9** Hide thy face from my sins, and blot out all my iniquities.**10** Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me.**11** Cast me not away from thy presence, and take not thy holy spirit from me.**12** Restore to me the joy of thy salvation, and uphold me with a willing spirit.

Hebrews 5 5-10 (p.205)

5 So also Christ did not exalt himself to be made a high priest, but was appointed by him who said to him, "Thou art my Son, today I have begotten thee"; **6** as he says also in another place, "Thou art a priest for ever, after the order of Melchiz'edek." **7** In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to him who was able to save him from death, and he was heard for his godly fear. **8** Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered; **9** and being made perfect he became the source of eternal salvation to all who obey him, **10** being designated by God a high priest after the order of Melchiz'edek.
