Behold, I have commanded a widow there to feed you." **10** So he arose and went to Zar'ephath; and when he came to the gate of the city, behold, a widow was there gathering sticks; and he called to her and said, "Bring me a little water in a vessel, that I may drink." **11** And as she was going to bring it, he called to her and said, "Bring me a morsel of bread in your hand." **12** And she said, "As the LORD your God lives, I have nothing baked, only a handful of meal in a jar, and a little oil in a cruse; and now, I am gathering a couple of sticks, that I may go in and prepare it for myself and my son, that we may eat it, and die." **13** And Eli'jah said to her, "Fear not; go and do as you have said; but first make me a little cake of it and bring it to me, and afterward make for yourself and your son. **14** For thus says the Lord the God of Israel, 'The jar of meal shall not be spent, and the cruse of oil shall not fail, until the day that the LORD sends rain upon the earth.'" **15** And she went and did as Eli'jah said; and she, and he, and her household ate for many days. **16** The jar of meal was not spent, neither did the cruse of oil fail, according to the word of the LORD which he spoke by Eli'jah.

John 6: 1-14

**1** After this Jesus went to the other side of the Sea of Galilee, which is the Sea of Tiber'i-as. **2** And a multitude followed him, because they saw the signs which he did on those who were diseased. **3** Jesus went up on the mountain, and there sat down with his disciples. **4** Now the Passover, the feast of the Jews, was at hand. **5** Lifting up his eyes, then, and seeing that a multitude was coming to him, Jesus said to Philip, "How are we to buy bread, so that these people may eat?" **6** This he said to test him, for he himself knew what he would do. **7** Philip answered him, "Two hundred denarii would not buy enough bread for each of them to get a little." **8** One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said to him, **9** "There is a lad here who has five barley loaves and two fish; but what are they among so many?" **10** Jesus said, "Make the people sit down." Now there was much grass in the place; so the men sat down, in number about five thousand. **11** Jesus then took the loaves, and when he had given thanks, he distributed them to those who were seated; so also the fish, as much as they wanted. **12** And when they had eaten their fill, he told his disciples, "Gather up the fragments left over, that nothing may be lost." **13** So they gathered them up and filled twelve baskets with fragments from the five barley loaves, left by those who had eaten. **14** When the people saw the sign which he had done, they said, "This is indeed the prophet who is to come into the world!"
