Epistle Colossians 1:24-29

(p.188)

24 Now I rejoice in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I complete what is lacking in Christ's afflictions for the sake of his body, that is, the church, **25** of which I became a minister according to the divine office which was given to me for you, to make the word of God fully known, **26** the mystery hidden for ages and generations but now made manifest to his saints. **27** To them God chose to make known how great among the Gentiles are the riches of the glory of this mystery, which is Christ in you, the hope of glory. **28** Him we proclaim, warning every man and teaching every man in all wisdom, that we may present every man mature in Christ. **29** For this I toil, striving with all the energy which he mightily inspires within me.

Gospel Matthew 18:1-14, 19:13-15

(p 18)

1 At that time the disciples came to Jesus, saying, "Who is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven?" **2** And calling to him a child, he put him in the midst of them, **3** and said, "Truly, I say to you, unless you turn and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. **4** Whoever humbles himself like this child, he is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven. **5** "Whoever receives one such child in my name receives me; **6** but whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him to have a great millstone fastened round his neck and to be drowned in the depth of the sea. **7** "Woe to the world for temptations to sin! For it is necessary that temptations come, but woe to the man by whom the temptation comes! **8** And if your hand or your foot causes you to sin, cut it off and throw it away; it is better for you to enter life maimed or lame than with two hands or two feet to be thrown into the eternal fire. **9** And if your eye causes you to sin, pluck it out and throw it away; it is better for you to enter life with one eye than with two eyes to be thrown into the hell of fire. **10** "See that you do not despise one of these little ones; for I tell you that in heaven their angels always behold the face of my Father who is in heaven. **12** What do you think? If a man has a hundred sheep, and one of them has gone astray, does he not leave the ninety-nine on the mountains and go in search of the one that went astray? **13** And if he finds it, truly, I say to you, he rejoices over it more than over the ninety-nine that never went astray. **14** So it is not the will of my Father who is in heaven that one of these little ones should perish. **13** Then children were brought to him that he might lay his hands on them and pray. The disciples rebuked the people; **14** but Jesus said, "Let the children come to me, and do not hinder them; for to such belongs the kingdom of heaven." **15** And he laid his hands on them and went away.
