H NOTICE OF NOMINATION – Section 22(2)

At a meeting held at Sherbrooke Mossspark Parish church on Saturday 4th September 2021, the Nominating Committee chose the person whom they wish to propose to this congregation of Sherbrooke Mossspark Parish Church to be our new minister. The name of the person proposed is Reverend Adam Dillon.

Arrangements have been made for Reverend Adam Dillon to conduct public worship in this Church on Sunday, 26th September 2021 at 10.30am. The service will also be live streamed via the internet to allow those not able to be physically present to view the service. A recording of the service will also be posted on the website of Sherbrooke Mossspark Parish Church.

Immediately after the service, there will be a vote on whether Reverend Adam Dillon should be appointed as the new minister of this congregation of Sherbrooke Mossspark Parish Church. Anyone whose name appears on the Electoral Register of this congregation of Sherbrooke Mossspark Parish Church shall be entitled to vote. No-one else shall be entitled to vote.

In accordance with Vacancy protocol (v2, 16 July 2020, Act VIII 2003), the vote may take place by those physically present by completing a hard copy of a voting paper, and in the case of those not, by their completing and posting or hand delivering a hard copy of a voting paper to Sherbrooke Mossspark Parish Church, 240 Nithsdale Road, Glasgow G41 5AD, marked for the attention of the Session Clerk, Mrs Clare Williams. All voting arrangements will ensure the secrecy of the ballot while maintaining verification of eligibility to vote. The ballot will remain open for seven days from 26th September 2021. Voting will therefore close at 12 noon on Sunday, 3rd October 2021.
