Gospel

John 2.1-11

(p.88)

1 On the third day there was a marriage at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there; **2** Jesus also was invited to the marriage, with his disciples. **3** When the wine failed, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." **4** And Jesus said to her, "O woman, what have you to do with me? My hour has not yet come." **5** His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." **6** Now six stone jars were standing there, for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. **7** Jesus said to them, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. **8** He said to them, "Now draw some out, and take it to the steward of the feast." So they took it. **9** When the steward of the feast tasted the water now become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward of the feast called the bridegroom **10** and said to him, "Every man serves the good wine first; and when men have drunk freely, then the poor wine; but you have kept the good wine until now." **11** This, the first of his signs, Jesus did at Cana in Galilee, and manifested his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

Covid Health & Safety Framework update: the Covid sub-committee has updated the health and safety framework with effect from 14th December 2021. Further details can be found on the Church website and consideration should be given of government advice to take advantage of free daily lateral flow tests. The key aspects are:

- **Masks:** to be worn inside the sanctuary (throughout the service) and in the hall while moving around
- **Singing:** please stand and sing with your masks on for all hymns if you wish.
- **Seating:** a return of the church pews with no allocation of seating; preregistering to attend services is still advisable.
- **Sanctuary and Halls:** in order to maximise ventilation throughout our church buildings, various doors will remain open both in the Sanctuary and Halls. We are also monitoring carbon dioxide levels both in the Sanctuary and Halls.
- **Movement between Sanctuary and Halls:** please take your time and keep your distance as a one-way system is no longer required. Please use the internal stairs or the east transept ramp to move between the Sanctuary and Halls. Adam has returned to greeting people in the main entrance vestibule after the service.
- **Tea and Coffee:** given the recent government advice on restricting socialising to three households around the Christmas period, the serving of tea and coffee after services has been suspended.
