COFFEE & CONVERSATION Ukrainian community afternoons at SMP

Just a year ago who would have thought 50 Ukrainians would ever travel to SMP on a sunny Wednesday afternoon and mix with 30 members of our community? Certainly not me, but there we are sitting discussing the local Glasgow culture, similarities and differences between traditions of Ukraine and Scotland. Songs have been sung, sweets have been thrown, organs played, many many cakes have been baked, served and consumed with dances led by both groups of people.

I personally view it all with a mixture of positivity and excitement that offers support and friendship to these displaced people, but it is with a background shrouded in darkness, as their homes are pulverised by Putin's tanks and missiles. Their stories are terrifying and their future very uncertain as the war continues and their home in Glasgow (for most, not all) soon floats away and is replaced by solid speculation.

Our twice monthly meetings have grown and adapted over the last few months. We are now at a stage of offering structured, hour-long language classes at various levels of ability. They are extremely well reviewed by our Ukrainian friends and prove a real pull to our guests to attend at SMP. These have become a bedrock of our offering.

Supporting the language sessions are music or story telling from both sides, as outlined above. The Guests also just like chatting and exchanging brief conversations about Glasgow and Scotland. In short, we give them a new environment, away from the 'Ship', in which things are just different, friendly and interesting.

Of course, getting to our church can be a challenge from HMS Ambition and the provision of a coach from Silverfox (crucially facilitated through Cosgrove Care our partners in this community engagement) has made a big difference to attendance.

We plan to continue this format making it clear to all Ukrainians that even as they are rehoused, we will be there to offer all the support SMP can muster.

There are many people from SMP and Cosgrove involved in organising and delivering these afternoons; thank you everyone.

FEEDBACK - I was very privileged to spend an hour last Wednesday with a group of Ukrainian Ladies discussing the potential issues facing them come April when they will have to leave their current accommodation on the Cruise Liner at Braehead.

With the aid of some postcards I tried to convey that Scotland is, in the main rural, with the population concentrated in the Central Belt with Glasgow in the west and Edinburgh in the east. Out-with that sector the population is in the main rural with the exception of Dundee, Aberdeen and Inverness in the North and a group of County Towns in the South.

The obvious issues, of which they are very aware, centre on accommodation, employment and language the last of which is currently being assisted by the classes at Sherbrooke Mosspark. In the main the accommodation and employment concerns can only be resolved at governmental level! - Ranald

The husband explained that he had been that morning attending a housing association south of Glasgow where he had been making an application for accommodation. He explained that they were being left on their own to look for a house and he explained that his preference was for accommodation near to Ibrox where their child was attending school. We had a discussion about the districts of Glasgow. The husband and wife with the excellent English then wanting to ask about Loch Ness, and the monster which they had heard about. The other mother and older daughter wanted to know about whether Scottish people preferred looking at hills or water and the conversation moved onto where we would go on holiday etc. We had a conversation about the relative distances and travel times between various towns in Scotland as compared with the Ukraine.

Everyone seems to enjoy talking and knowing more about Scotland. It really was good fun - John
